Before You Begin



CAUTION Local regulation requires licensed plumbers and electricians to install utilities. All plumbing and utilities must conform to prevailing local codes.



NOTE Unpack the vacuum, remove the cover, and thoroughly inspect the internal and external components to ensure that no damage occurred during shipping.

- Verify the electrical and hose connections.
- Verify voltage is within specifications, including the confirmation of good ground,

• Acceptable voltage range is 200-240 VAC. Voltage outside of that range will require a buck-boost transformer that provides an incoming voltage adjustment of +/- 10%.

• Ensure Intake, Drain, drip leg and Exhaust hoses are long enough to reach the offices connection points. Build out office piping as needed or ensure a professional plumber is available.



NOTE Do not trim the Exhaust hose. All other hoses can be trimmed to size.

• Evaluate the room's air flow and overall temperature to maintain the recommended 40-104 degrees Fahrenheit. Make adjustments or recommendations if out of range.








Single Vacuum Installation Examples

Below Grade Installation Example




Install a Single Vacuum




WARNING Ensure that there is at least 1" of clearance between the vacuum and the floor to provide adequate air flow.

Do Not Use These Fittings











Connect the Intake Hose to the Trunk Line

- Trim the intake hose to fit the length needed.
- Do not let the intake hose sag or have low spots.
- Support the hose if necessary.




Connect the Drain Hose to the Drain

- Trim the drain hose to fit the length needed.
- Do not let the drain hose sag or have low spots.
- Support the hose if necessary.




Connect the Drain Hose to the Vacuum




Drain connection can be rotated 240° to suit the installation.



Connect the Drain Hose to a Floor Sink/Drain




Connect the Drain Hose to a Pipe Stub with an Air Gap




Slope the Drain hose 1/2"/10' towards floor drain. An air gap is required. Traps in the drain piping must be no greater than 8" above grade. Connect the drain hose directly to the vent.

Connect the Exhaust

- Do not trim the exhaust hose. Install it at full length.
- Loosely coil the remaining exhaust hose on the floor behind the vacuum pump to ensure the tubing will not kink.
- Must be vented outside per NFPA.
- Trim the drip leg hose for the best run to the floor drain.
- Route the drip leg hose to the drain so it is lower than the exhaust elbow. This prevents water from backing up into the vacuum.






Connect the Washdown Waterline



CAUTION Local regulation requires licensed plumbers and electricians to install utilities. All plumbing and utilities must conform to prevailing local codes.



NOTE Washdown connection is required for endodontic offices. A-dec recommends the optional washdown system in all dental clinics.






NOTE Depending on local codes, the water washdown connection may require a backflow preventer.

Below Grade Intake Installation Example






NOTE Trim intake hoses so they have the shortest and smoothest run from the manifold to the tank inlet.

NOTE Level the vacuums to each other to ensure workloads are balanced properly.


Install a Tandem Vacuum System (optional)




NOTE Tandem vacuums must be combinations of the same model vacuums. For connecting more than three vacuums, contact A-dec's Customer Service.

Build the Tandem Intake Manifold Assembly

- The parts for the Tandem intake manifold are included with Tandem vacuum orders. Adjust their installation according to the location's needs.
- Manifolds can be configured to accept air intake from either side. When assembling the manifold, ensure the
 check valves are installed correctly according to the markings on the manifold that indicate which side should
 be up, and an arrow indicating the airflow goes from the manifold to the vacuum.
- Check valves must always be in a horizontal position.

Connect the Intake Hose to the Trunk Line


The instructions for connecting to the building are the same whether you're connecting the Intake hose from the tank inlet or a manifold.

Connect the Exhaust Hoses


- Do not trim the Exhaust hose.
- Route the drip leg hose to the drain so it is lower than the exhaust elbow. This prevents water from backing up into the vacuum.

Only use one 2 x 2 x 2" WYE per line.

For installations with more than 3 vacuums or exhaust lines greater than 70' in length, please consult with an A-dec Technical Service advisor.

Connect the Electrical



CAUTION Local regulation requires licensed plumbers and electricians to install utilities. All plumbing and utilities must conform to prevailing local codes.

Electrical Safety

- Follow NEC, NFPA 99C, and all local codes.
- Qualified personnel must install electrical wiring and outlets.
- Unit requires a dedicated (separate branch circuit only) 20 or 30 amp circuit.
- Unit requires an external disconnecting device which disconnects each live supply conductor.
- Never operate unit outside the specified voltage range 200-240 VAC.
- See "Site Specifications and Sizing Information" on page 3 for more electrical information.



WARNING Do not attempt to operate the vacuum on voltage other than what is specified on page 2.




WARNING Only use the remote switch or the switch on the vacuum to operate the vacuum. Do not run/stop the vacuum by turning the main power on/off.

Connect the Main Supply Wiring




WARNING Electrical shock can occur if the vacuum is improperly grounded. The vacuum must be connected only to a supply mains with protective earth.




Vacuum Stacked on Compressor

Install the Compressor Feet




Level the Compressor




- **1** Position the compressor and place a level on the top of its side. For information about the minimum clearance needed around the compressor, see the *A-dec SC Air Compressor Installation Guide*, p/n 86.0890.00, available in the Resource Center at www.a-dec.com.
- **2** Move the level from side to side and front to back while adjusting the height of the feet until the compressor is level.

Install the Vacuum Feet



Install the Rubber Pads




- **1** Install two rubber pads 2-3/8" from the front of the compressor and aligned with the sides.
- **2** Install two rubber pads 2" from the back of the compressor and aligned with the sides.

Lift the Vacuum on Top of the Compressor




WARNING It takes two people to place the vacuum on top of the compressor.




1 Place the vacuum on the rubber pads on top of the compressor.

Secure the Vacuum to the Compressor




- **1** Slide the bracket over the foot of the vacuum.
- **2** Use a 3/8" hex driver and self-drilling screw to attach the bracket to the compressor.
- **3** Repeat the steps for the other vacuum feet.

1 Tie the lanyard around the separator tank outlet elbow.

2 Secure the other end of the lanyard into a wall stud or drywall anchor.


LED Push-Button Controls and/or Remote Monitoring Hub

Initial Startup Checklist



WARNING Keep hands clear of moving parts. This system can start automatically without warning.

- Inspect unit for any visible signs of damage that may have occurred during installation.
- Verify the electrical connection attachments, and that incoming line voltage is between 200 VAC and 240 VAC.
- · Activate main disconnect switch or circuit breaker.
- Turn on the vacuum, and ensure unit starts. If not, refer to "Status Lights" on page 32.
- Check the gauge on the front of the vacuum for proper vacuum level. For the proper setting, see the **Set** "**HG** column in the table in "Site Specifications and Sizing Information" on page 3.
- Check that all of the HVEs and SEs have proper suction.
- Check for leaks in all connections and the piping system.

Turn off the vacuum.


- **Optional** Verify washdown operation begins 45-60 seconds after turning off the vacuum. Listen for the solenoid to open the water line and look at the drain check valve to confirm that the water is draining.
- Verify the Drain hose flows cleanly and has no low spots to trap debris.
- If remote buttons or a touchscreen are in use:
 - Switch the rocker to the remote position.
 - Verify the system turns on / off with remote switches or trouchscreen.
- If the system uses remote monitoring, call A-dec Customer Service to confirm it is reporting.

Status Lights


Status lights are located on the circuit board and explain how the vacuum is currently working. To access the status lights, remove the service panel from the front of the vacuum. If you are having an issue and these status lights do not help resolve your issue, contact A-dec Customer Service.




The vacuum has been turned on at the local switch, and is running.




The **Remote** switch to the vacuum, either the Smart Shield touchscreen or the LED Push-Buttons, has been enabled from the local switch.

The **On** signal is not detected from the **Remote** switch, so the vacuum is not running.



The **Remote** switch to the vacuum, either the Smart Shield touchscreen or the LED Push-Buttons, has been enabled from the local switch.

The **On** signal is detected from the **Remote** switch, so the vacuum is running.



The **Float** switch is on, which stops the vacuum because water has filled up the separator tank.

The vacuum starts 10 seconds after the water level has dropped enough to turn the **Float** switch off, then this light turns off.
