Before You Begin



ATTENTION Circuit boards are sensitive to static electricity. Electrostatic Discharge (ESD) precautions are required when touching a circuit board or making connections to or from the circuit board. Circuit boards should be installed only by an electrician or qualified service person.



WARNING Shock hazard. When you remove or replace the covers, take care not to damage any wiring or tubing. Verify that the covers are secure after you replace them.



NOTE Information that is critical to a successful installation is shaded like this note.

- Clear the room of all debris and thoroughly clean the floors.
- · Verify that manual air and water shut-offs are installed.
- Purge any debris from air and water lines then turn both lines off.
- Check with local building and code authorities about installation requirements specific to your location.

- Combination wrenches: 3/8", 1/2"
- Ratchet and sockets: 5/16", 9/16", 3/4"
- Drill bits: 3/8" (9.5 mm), 1/2" (12.5 mm)

Install the Chair

Position the Chair

Recommended Tools


- 3/16" hex key
- 9/16" socket and ratchet

Task 1. Remove packaging material and any loose items from around the chair.



NOTE Set aside any kits and manuals included for the doctor (such as the *A-dec* 311 and 411 Dental Chairs Instructions For Use, p/n 86.0546.00).

Task 2.




1 Use a 9/16" socket and ratchet to remove the bolts and brackets securing the chair to the pallet.

Task 3.




CAUTION To avoid damaging the chair, do not lift from the chair back when removing it from the pallet.

1 Grasp the chair by an armrest and the front mount to lift it from the pallet and position it on the treatment room floor.



Task 4.






NOTE If the chair doesn't rise on the third tap, turn off power to the chair and wait 10 seconds before turning the power back on. A few seconds after returning power to the chair, repeat the three tap procedure. Be sure to hold the stop plate on the third tap.

Task 5.

- **1** Plug in and turn on the power to the chair.
- **2** Tap the stop plate three times and continue to hold the plate on the third tap until both the chair base and chair back rise to their highest position.



Anchor the Chair



WARNING Anchoring the chair to the floor is required for mechanical stability. Failure to anchor the chair properly could result in damage, serious injury, or death.




CAUTION Check the flooring and/or framing material where you will anchor the chair. If it is not at least 3-1/4" (82 mm) thick, contact a licensed contractor about reinforcing the floor.

Recommended Tools

- Drill
- Rotary hammer
- Concrete floor: 1/2" (12.5 mm) drill bit and 9/16" socket and ratchet
- Wood floor: 3/8" (9.5 mm) drill bit and 3/4" socket and ratchet

Task 2. Complete the procedure for the type of flooring in the treatment room.


Anchor the Chair to a Concrete Floor

1 Use a rotary hammer with a 1/2" (12.5 mm) bit to drill a 4" (101 mm) deep hole through the anchoring hole in the baseplate.

2 Remove any debris.

3 Drive the anchor bolt into the hole until the bolt head seats against the baseplate.

4 Use a 9/16" socket and ratchet to securely tighten the bolt against the washer so that it firmly holds the baseplate to the floor.




Anchor the Chair to a Wood Floor

1 Use a 3/8" (9.5 mm) bit to drill a 2" (50 mm) deep hole through the anchoring hole in the baseplate.

2 Remove any debris.

3 Use a 3/4" socket and ratchet to securely tighten the bolt against the washer so that it firmly holds the baseplate to the floor.



Install the Back Support

Recommended Tool

• 3/16" hex key



1 Remove the three mounting screws and lock washers from the back support.



CAUTION Be sure to tighten the screws firmly to prevent the back from becoming loose during use.

2 Attach the back support to the chair back with the mounting screws and lock washers.




TIP Start all three screws before tightening them.

Install the Floor Box

Recommended Tools


- Phillips head screwdriver
- Diagonal cutters
- Tape measure

Task 1.




- **1** Place the floor box frame around the utilities.
- **2** Use four of the following to attach the frame to the floor:
 - Wood floors: 1-1/4" screws
 - Concrete floors: 2" anchors
- **3** Slide the umbilical clip into the slot in the frame.

Task 2.



- **1** Measure the distance between the chair and the floor box.
- **2** Cut the convolute to size.

Task 3.






NOTE Ensure the bottom of the convolute is fully seated into the clip so that the covers install properly.

Install the Upholstery

The upholstery for the A-dec 411 Dental Chair includes the seat, back, and a dual-articulating headrest.



Install the Seat Upholstery



- **1** Raise the chair.
- **2** Move the armrests forward.
- **3** Pull out the side covers.
- **4** Line up the holes in the seat upholstery with the holes in the chair frame.
- Push the pins through the seat upholstery and chair frame until the rings touch the seat.
- **6** Reinstall the side covers.

Install the Back Upholstery



- **1** Ensure the chair back is fully raised and the chair base is fully lowered.
- **2** Place the key holes in the back upholstery over the fastener posts on the chair back.
- **3** Push down until the top of the back upholstery aligns with the chair back.

Install the Headrest Upholstery

Locking knob and lever-release headrests are both available for the A-dec 411 Dental Chair. The headrest upholstery installs the same way for both styles.

Recommended Tools

Locking Knob: 1/8" hex keyLever Release: 7/64" hex key


Task 1.

1 Line up the holes in the headrest upholstery with those in the headrest cover.

2 Insert and tighten the mounting screws. <




Prepare and Adjust the System

Secure the Wires and Tubing

Recommended Tool

• Diagonal cutters



1 Install the bail. It ships in the floor box kit.




CAUTION Do not secure the tubing to the lift arm. The tubing needs to move freely when the chair moves.

2 Use cable ties to group the tubing and wiring for a neat appearance.

Adjust the Glide Bar Tension

Recommended Tool


• 1/8" hex key



Adjust the Armrest Tension

Recommended Tool

• 5/32" hex key



- **1** Pull out the side cover.
- **2** Lift up the seat upholstery.
- **3** Use a hex key to adjust the tension. Clockwise increases the tension.
- **4** Reinstall the side cover.

Adjust the Swivel Brake Tension

Recommended Tool

• 7/64" hex key



1 Move the swivel brake handle to the right.



NOTE If the chair includes a back mount module, swivel the chair to access the adjustment screw.

2 Use a 7/64" hex key to adjust the tension. Clockwise increases the tension.



NOTE A small adjustment significantly increases or decreases the tension.

Adjust the Chair Base Down Speed

Recommended Tool

• 3/32" hex key

Adjust the speed that the chair lowers by turning the setscrew on the flow control stem of the hydraulic manifold.



1 Use a 3/32" hex key to turn the setscrew on the flow control stem.

Turning the setscrew clockwise reduces the chair base down speed.



NOTE If it takes longer than 45 seconds for the chair to reach its lowest position, some programmed positions may time out and the chair may not function correctly.

Customize Dental Chair Settings

Standard Touchpad

Use the touchpad to customize commonly used settings for the system.

Customize Chair Preset Positions

To program Entry/Exit, Treatment 1, and Treatment 2 buttons:

- **1.** Move the chair into the desired position.
- **2.** Press and release **p** and you will hear a beep indicating program mode.
- 3. Within a few seconds, press the button you want to customize. Three beeps confirms the setting is saved. If you take too long to press the button, the system times out and you will need to press and release **p** again.

Customize X-Ray/Rinse Button

The X-ray/Rinse button toggles the chair between its current position and the x-ray/rinse position. It can also be programmed as a third preset chair position (Treatment 3).

To configure the x-ray/rinse button as a third preset chair position:

- Press and hold p and ← at the same time for three seconds.
 - One beep indicates the button is configured as Treatment 3.
 - Three beeps indicate that the button is configured as the X-ray/Rinse preset.
- **2.** When the button is configured as the Treatment 3 preset, customize the chair position as instructed in the previous section, "Customize Chair Preset Positions".



TIP When the X-ray/Rinse button is configured as a third preset, it functions the same as Treatment 1 and 2 buttons.



Standard Touchpad

Chair Preset Positions

Button	Factory Setting
-Ġ	Entry/Exit: Positions the chair for entry/exit of patient and turns off the dental light.
•~	Treatment 1: Lowers the chair base and back and turns on the dental light.
` ~	Treatment 2: Positions the chair base and back and turns on the dental light.
٠.٤	X-ray/Rinse: Toggles between X-ray/Rinse and current position. The dental light turns off when the chair is positioned for X-ray/Rinse and turns on when it returns to the previous position.



NOTE To stop the chair at any point, push any chair position button on the footswitch or touchpad.

Test the System

Complete the following checklist to test the system, then follow up with the customer.

Dental Chair

- · Dental chair is securely anchored to the floor
- Chair functions properly, including the chair's lift, tilt, and programmable functions controlled by the touchscreen and foot switch
- · Armrests function properly
- Swivel brake functions properly
- Headrest functions properly
- Upholstery is securely installed

Utilities

- Regulated air pressure is at 80 psi
- Floor box is free of air and water leaks
- Excess wires are coiled and stored away from moving parts

Install the Covers



NOTE Be sure to adjust and test the system before installing the covers.




WARNING Shock hazard. When you remove or replace the covers, take care not to damage any wiring or tubing. Verify that the covers are secure after you replace them.

Install the Lift Arm Cover

1 Position the chair so that it is raised halfway up.

2 Insert the posts on the lift arm into the slots on one side of the cover.

3 Insert the posts into the slots on the other side of the cover.



Install the Pump and Floor Box Covers

Recommended Tool


• 3/16" hex key

Task 1.



1 If the system includes a floor box, remove the slot from the front of the pump cover.


Task 2.



Install the Mount Cover



NOTE If the system includes a support link, use the slotted back mount cover that fits around the link.



1 Snap the mount cover in place. The four posts go into the holes on the mount.
